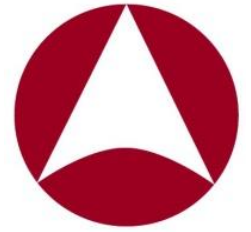


# ROAD SAFETY AUDIT REFRESHER
